

Dear Artists.

NBAM/ArtWorks! is seeking artists for our Teen Artist Internship Program (TAIP). We are looking for local artists who would enjoy the opportunity to share their studio space and mentor a young person with a passion for the arts.

TAIP works like this:

- **1.** Teens who have a passion and training in visual arts complete an application form and are recommended by their teacher or guidance counselor at their high school. Application deadline is December 1, 2015.
- **2.** All interns and their artist mentors will have a general meeting at NBAM/ArtWorks! to go over the general expectations for the program. This meeting is scheduled for January 21, 2016 at 5pm.
- **3.** Artists will schedule meeting times with their intern (minimum 4 hours per week) at their studio. (NBAM/ArtWorks! classrooms may be available if needed.) During this time, artists and students will share ideas, discuss current art movements, and work together in making pieces of artwork to display at the NBAM/ArtWorks! "The Vault" gallery main floor in April, 2016
- 4. TAIP is scheduled to run from February 1 to March 31, 2016. The exhibition will run from April 14th with an opening reception from 5 to 7pm until April 30th 2016. The students and mentors plan a shared exhibit that features the work of all of the interns and artists together. An exhibition catalog and postcard will be produced to document the experience.
- **5.** Each participating artist will receive a small stipend for supplies and use of their studio.

If you are able to participate, please return the artist application and safety contract to us ASAP. Our previous programs were extremely successful, and we have many high school students eager to participate. These future artists need your support.
