NBAM/ArtWorks! Fun Cool Arts Kids summer program classes are designed to allow children the freedom to make art and develop skills in a relaxed atmosphere. Our classes offer opportunities to explore a variety of media each day to discover the joy of creativity.

Fun offerings this summer include: 2D workshops in drawing, painting, printmaking, papermaking, books and collage.

3D workshops in sculpture and clay (includes jewelry). Check out this summer's workshops for age groups: 6–9 and 10–13.

Early drop-off: 8:30–9:00 AM (addt'l \$5.00 per day). Extended day (if you need to pick up later than class ending time) 3:30 to 5:30 PM (addt'l \$10.00 per hour). Must advise at time of registration to accommodate. Drop-off is not available before 8:30 AM.

A deposit of \$50.00 is required to hold your child's place in any class. Multiple weeks require \$20.00 per week additional deposit. 50% of your deposit is non-refundable. Example: 3 registered weeks deposit = \$90.00

- Sessions run Monday—Friday and are 3 hours per day in length (morning or afternoon sessions).
 Enrollment is for 5 days for optimum experience.
- · No refunds are given for missed days.
- Class sizes are small there is a maximum of 10–12 students per class to ensure quality instruction.
- Cost per session is \$135.00 members / \$150.00 non-members. Clay sessions are \$157.00 members / \$175.00 non-members. Fees include all supplies and instruction. If you are thinking about joining NBAM/ArtWorks! a family membership is \$75.00 per year and your 10% membership discount can be applied toward all workshops, classes and gallery retail purchases.
- If you sign your child up for both the AM and PM sessions pack your child a lunch and a beverage as well as snacks for breaks. Children will have a supervised half hour lunch break.
- Transportation may be available at an additional cost for full day students. Please call to inquire.

Painting & Drawing

2D workshops draw, paint, collage with a variety of media (watercolor, acrylic paint, ink, pencil and recycled paper materials), anything that can be applied to a 2D surface.

Sculpture

3D workshops create sculptural objects in the round. They have depth as an added dimension and exist as built objects. The media used can be found objects, recycled bottles, cans and paper, wood, metal, papier maché, and cardboard.

Ceramics

We will be working with low-fire white stoneware inspired by the weekly themes. Younger students learn basic hand-building techniques and get familiar with clay as a medium. Older or more experienced students can do wheel-throwing under an instructor's guidance.

Weekly guidelines and themes are provided with the course listings, however we remain flexible to the focus of the workshops based on the interests of our students.
