## **“Frederick Douglass Portrait” Part 2**

### **Materials:**

<b>B/W coloring page</b>	Portrait of Frederick Douglass
<b>1 Canvas board</b>	9:x12” or 8”x10”
<b>Acrylic Paint</b>	Primary colors & white
<b>Paintbrush</b>	Small
<b>Sponge</b>	A small piece of sponge
<b>Scissors</b>	To cut out portrait & quote
<b>Glue</b>	Glue stick or White glue

### **Follow Video on Frederick Douglass Portrait**

**Step 1.** Use the sponging technique demonstrated in the video to apply paint to your entire canvas board. Choose between cool colors or warm colors. Then let dry - you have now completed your background.

**Step 2.** Take your Frederick Douglass quote (from part1) and either cut it into separate sections (as I did in the tutorial) or leave in a rectangular block. Trim excess white space around the text.

**Step 3.** Before gluing, position and reposition your quote as well as your Frederick Douglass cutout (from part 1) until you are satisfied with the final layout. Then glue it down using either glue stick or white glue.

*\*(Make sure all edges are glued down completely)*
